- Uses a consensus-oriented decision making process

WWF coordinates but does not manage the process

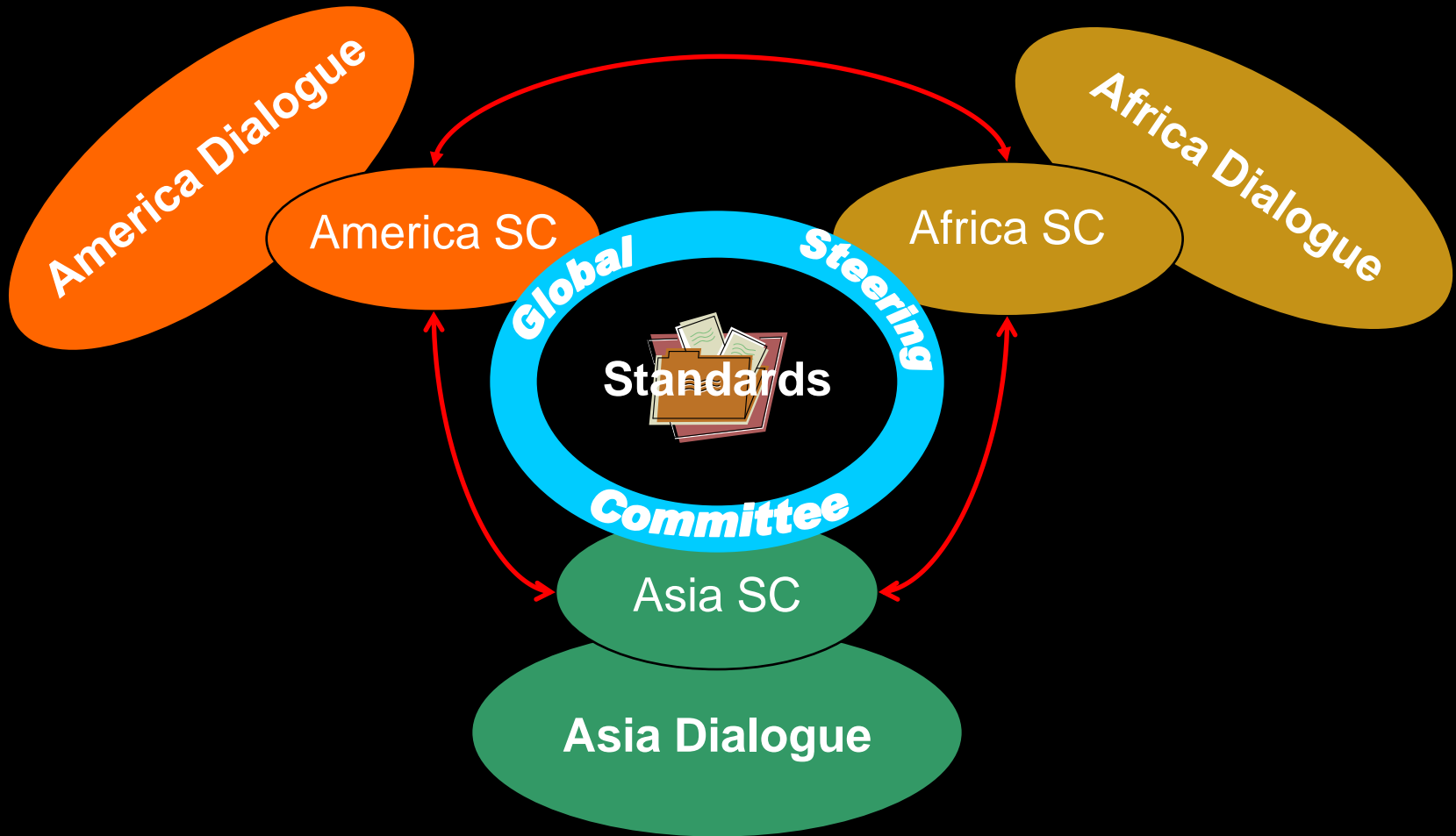


Who serves on the steering committee?
